

Stage 3. Travel Restrictions Sandy Lake First Nation

April 3, 2020

Scheduled or charter flights are not permitted into Sandy Lake First Nation unless airlines abide by the following conditions.

- 1) The Sandy Lake Pandemic Response Team must pre-approve all passengers in and out of Sandy Lake. Airlines will not board passengers without this approval.
- 2) Only doctors, nurses, police and other essential service personnel will be permitted.
- 3) Medical patients are not permitted to return unless they meet and follow strict requirements.
 - There must be a pre-approved safety plan to ensure the following;
 - Passenger undergoes a screening process before returning and upon arrival
 - Passenger must self-isolate for 14 days
 - The passenger's home or alternate location is safe to self-isolate without interference
 - Passenger fully understands and agrees to abide by the self-isolation requirements
 - The passenger will go straight from the airport to their self-isolating location
- 4) No passengers are to leave Sandy Lake.
 - If anyone leaves, they may not be permitted to come back
 - The triage nurse and doctor will decide whether a patient needs to travel out for medical reasons
- 5) Flights are required for essential medical supplies, prescription medication and lab specimens in and out of the community.
- 6) Medivac flights are permitted.
- 7) Cargo flights are permitted with no passengers.
- 8) Scheduled flights may bring in cargo.

Note: these directives are subject to change with further restrictions
