Your ongoing commitment protects the health and safety of all patients, staff, professional staff, and the community. If you travel anywhere outside of Northwestern Ontario, you must self-isolate for a period of 14 days upon return. Staff who choose to travel outside of Northwestern Ontario as of March 30, 2020 will not be compensated by the Hospital for the isolation period. Travel restrictions will be reviewed and may be adjusted as the provincial government updates policies. Our ability to ease travel restrictions is also depended on our capacity for in-house swab testing for COVID-19, which is currently lower than some other areas of Ontario. In recent weeks, members of the Lakehead University community have demonstrated support for health care providers in Thunder Bay through PPE collections, the manufacturing of PPE parts, and related research. Lakehead University and our Hospital recently signed an agreement to provide temporary accommodations for hospital staff who need such accommodations outside of their family home. Those who would like to be considered for offsite accommodation must contact Occupational Health & Safety. If temporary space is required, Hospital staff would only be able to use the University apartment building units that are completely separated from other campus living spaces. This arrangement will not apply to hospital staff if they have been diagnosed with COVID-19, or are deemed highly presumptive as a result of work-related exposure. The University extends gratitude and appreciation for everything frontline health care workers are doing to manage this pandemic.

Today is the final day for staff and professional staff to participate in a survey regarding the impact of and the response to the Hospital's COVID-19.
